Concrete Polishing.

(Class is 40hrs)

Intro/Intermediate

This Course is designed to introduce the basic Knowledge of the concrete polishing process. The process begins with fundamentals, assessing and planning needed for the job. The polishing equipment and tooling for grinding, honing, and polishing are discussed and applied, as well as determining the hardness and getting the required aggregate exposure are needed to start a project. Applying densifiers and hands-on use of the machines will round out the course.

Resinous/Epoxy.

(Class is 40hrs)

Intro/Intermediate

This course is designed to introduce the floor layer to resinous flooring such as: increasing their knowledge of products used, developing the skills needed to apply a resinous product. The floor layer will learn how to properly prepare the substrate such as repairing, filling joints, creating a chase and profiling the substrate. The process of mixing and applying the resinous products will round out this course.

Intermediate/Advanced

This course is designed to advance the floor layers knowledge of the application process in the most common applied products of resinous flooring. Different procedures of resinous floors will be incorporated such as cementitious urethane systems, troweled applied and self-leveling slurry, MMA systems, and hybrid systems which is combining multiple systems. Layout of multiple colors, stairs and landings and wall application will round out this course
